### SECTION XI CHANCELLOR'S REPORT

Dr. Neil Scott gave an update on enrollment numbers. Summer enrollment is 4.69% ahead in headcount year-to-date and 4.11% ahead in credit-hour production year-to-date. Per Dr. Scott, 18 out of 23 colleges are up in headcount and 17 out of 23 are up in credit-hour production.

As of July 9, 2024, Fall enrollment was 10.6% ahead in applications year-to-date, and there were 6,949 more applications with significant increases in first-time freshmen, dual enrollment, and transfer applications. We are also significantly ahead in registrations and credit-hour production year-to-date. Data indicates we are 19.2% ahead in head count over last Fall and 16.7% ahead in credit-hour production year-to-date. These increases can be attributed to the colleges remaining laser-focused on student success, as well as better retention of current students and better conversion of new applicants. Some colleges are also offering registration earlier than in previous years. Regarding Workforce and Adult Education, 2,957 students have enrolled in Summer programs, with 5,844 total registrations.

Dr. Scott also addressed the issue of student mental health, which has been a concern for a while. Per Dr. Scott, part of student success is looking at the students' mental health needs. In Fall 2023, the ACCS began accepting proposals from companies who specialize in providing mental health services to college students. Earlier this summer, the ACCS signed a contract with a company who will provide quality mental health services to the students, faculty, and staff beginning Fall 2024. Services will include a 24/7 crisis line answered by licensed counselors, scheduled mental telecounseling sessions 50 minutes in length, and a Wellness Hub website with access to self-help videos about various mental health-related topics.

Dr. Scott added that by having a contract, these services can be offered at minimal cost. Dr. Scott thanked Taylor Hilyer, Director of Student Life, for heading up this project.
