WALLACE COMMUNITY COLLEGE - HANCEVILLE APPROVAL OF INCREASE IN DORM RENTAL AND BOARD RATES

On motion by Ms. Gray, second by Mr. Rhone, the Board of Trustees authorized Wallace State Community College – Hanceville to increase the College's housing fee and increase the optional meal plan fee. The rate increases will take effect Fall Semester 2025.

ALABAMA COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM 2025 – 2026 BUDGET REQUEST

On motion by Mr. Rhone, second by Ms. Gray, the Board of Trustees approved the 2025-2026 budget request for the Alabama Community College System and the Alabama Community College System Office as outlined.

Fiscal Consideration: \$694,131,769 - Operations Request from the Education Trust Fund (ETF)

CHATTAHOOCHEE VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
ASSOCIATE IN APPLIED SCIENCE IN ELECTRICAL TECHNOLOGY

On motion by Mr. Lightsey, second by Ms. Gray, the Board of Trustees authorized Chattahoochee Valley Community College's application for an Associate in Applied Science in Electrical Technology, to be implemented Fall Semester 2025.

Fiscal Consideration: The College estimates that a total of \$257,456 is required to support the program and \$557,280 is projected to be available through internal allocations, tuition, and extramural funds.

ENTERPRISE STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE CERTIFICATE IN COSMETOLOGY

On motion by Mr. Mitchell, second by Mr. Shell, the Board of Trustees approved Enterprise State Community College's application for a Certificate in Cosmetology, to be implemented Spring Semester 2025.

Fiscal Consideration: The College estimates that a total of \$458,000 is required to support the program and \$893,430 is projected to be available through internal allocations, tuition, and extramural funds.

NORTHEAST ALABAMA COMMUNITY COLLEGE ASSOCIATE IN APPLIED SCIENCE IN DIAGNOSTIC MEDICAL SONOGRAPHY

On motion by Ms. Gray, second by Mr. Shell, the Board of Trustees approved Northeast Alabama Community College's application for an Associate in Applied Science in Diagnostic Medical Sonography, to be implemented Fall Semester 2025.

Fiscal Consideration: The College estimates that a total of \$2,335,500 is required to support the program and \$2,428,792 is projected to be available through internal allocations, tuition, and extramural funds.

NORTHEAST ALABAMA COMMUNITY COLLEGE ASSOCIATE IN APPLIED SCIENCE IN MEDICAL LABORATORY TECHNOLOGY

On motion by Ms. Gray, second by Mr. Shell, the Board of Trustees approved Northeast Alabama Community College's application for an Associate in Applied Science in Clinical/Medical Laboratory Technician, to be implemented Fall Semester 2025.

Fiscal Consideration: The College estimates that \$2,082,500 is required to support the program and \$2,428,792 will be available through extramural and tuition to support the program.

REID STATE TECHNICAL COLLEGEPURCHASE OF BLACK ANGUS PROPERTY

On motion by Mr. Mitchell, second by Mr. Lightsey, the Board of Trustees authorized Reid State Technical College to proceed with the project named Purchase of Black Angus Property.

Fiscal Consideration: TOTAL PROJECT COST \$140,000

SHELTON STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE MARTIN CAMPUS 2ND FLOOR RENOVATIONS

On motion by Mr. Houston, second by Mr. Rhone, the Board of Trustees authorized Shelton State Community College to proceed with the project named Martin Campus 2nd Floor Renovations (Swing Space AV Installation Package).

Fiscal Consideration: TOTAL PROJECT COST \$2,189,591

BEVILL STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGEJASPER CAMPUS CLEM GYMNASIUM RENOVATION

On motion by Mr. Lightsey, second by Mr. Shell, the Board of Trustees authorized Bevill State Community College to proceed with the project named Jasper Campus Clem Gym Renovation (approval of Changer Order #4).

Fiscal Consideration: TOTAL PROJECT COST \$6,419,798

BEVILL STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE JASPER INDUSTRIAL COURT CAMPUS HVAC BUILDING RENOVATION FOR WEATHERIZATION

On motion by Mr. Lightsey, second by Mr. Shell, the Board of Trustees authorized Bevill State Community College to proceed with the project named Jasper Industrial Court Campus HVAC Building Renovation for Weatherization.

Fiscal Consideration: TOTAL PROJECT COST \$1,110,183

SECTION XI CHANCELLOR'S REPORT

Dr. Neil Scott, Vice Chancellor of Student Success, gave an update on enrollment numbers. Per Dr. Scott, Fall 2024 saw a 7.71% increase in enrollment in for-credit courses over Fall 2023. This is the highest Fall headcount since 2011-2012. There was a 4.9% increase over Fall 2023 in credit hour production. This is the highest Fall credit hour production since 2019-2020. Spring 2025 shows a 9.42% increase over Spring 2024 YTD. This is 5,386 more students YTD. There is also an 8.1% increase over Spring 2024 YTD. This is 40,744 more credit hours YTD.

Dr. Scott further added that 7,010 students have enrolled in Workforce Development programs since August 1, 2024. There were 17,639 total registrations. There were also 14,115 registrations for Adult Education programs.

Chancellor Baker mentioned that on February 5th at 1:30 p.m., the ACCS will make its presentation to the joint budget committees to discuss budget requests. Until then, meetings are being arranged with the Presidents to discuss the budget requests. This budget request contains a significant increase across the board for funding pay increases for all employees. More information will be provided at a later date.
