
Emergency Projects

ACCS Procedure



- 1. <u>Mitigate the Immediate Crisis</u> Work required to limit or stop damage to assets and secure the area for the health and safety of the public
 - a. May contact a licensed and insured contractor to address the immediate crisis
 - b. Contractor to provide a written quote/proposal
 - i. Make sure the contract does not contain waiver of subrogation language
 - c. No need for advertisement for bids
- 2. <u>Contact the Insurance Carrier</u> Report the property claim as soon as possible
 - a. Call Alabama Division of Risk Management (DORM) at 334-223-6146
 - b. Include DORM claim # on O/A Agreements
 - Declare an Emergency Declare an emergency so the project can be administered correctly
 - a. Declaration of Emergency letter

- i. Addressed to Chancellor Jimmy Baker
- ii. Briefly describe the type of emergency
 - 1. Threat to public health
 - 2. Threat to public safety
 - 3. Threat to public security
 - 4. Threat to the economic welfare of the State
- iii. Briefly describe the crisis and how that is affecting the applicable emergency
- iv. State the intent to secure the services of a Design Professional, note the name if one has already been selected
- v. State the intent to solicit construction proposals for repair and/or replacement work to address the emergency but not beyond that scope
- vi. Signed by College President
- b. Email copy of Declaration of Emergency letter to ACCS Chief Facilities Officer

4. <u>Secure the Services of a Design Professional</u>

- a. Complete an Agreement Between Owner and Architect (O/A Agreement)
- b. Design Professional will assess the site, recommend any actions to prevent further damage, issue plans and specifications to repair damaged areas and replace equipment
- c. Agreement must be limited to addressing the immediate crisis to meet the emergency and not go beyond the scope of such work
- d. Design Professional to be in constant contact and cooperative with the adjuster and Loss Consultant
- 5. <u>Solicit at Least Three Contractor's Proposals</u> The emergency declaration allows for the solicitation of proposals without advertisement for bid
 - a. Document that a minimum of three proposals were sought for the work, even if a lesser number respond
 - b. Issue of Tabulation of Bids
 - c. Complete a Construction Contract
 - d. Scope of work must be limited to repair and/or replacement to meet the emergency and cannot go beyond the scope of such work
