

**ALABAMA COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM BOARD OF TRUSTEES
MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON
WEDNESDAY DECEMBER 10, 2025, 10:00 A.M.**

The Alabama Community College System Board of Trustees (also referred to herein as the Board) held a meeting at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 10, 2025, in the Jimmy H. Baker Center for the Arts at Enterprise State Community College in Enterprise, Alabama. The meeting was called in accordance with Act No. 2015-125.

SECTION VII
COLLEGE SPOTLIGHT – ENTERPRISE STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Mr. Danny Long, President of Enterprise State, recognized the faculty and staff of the college and thanked them for their work. President Long next introduced Mr. Mike McDaniel, former student at Enterprise State. Mr. McDaniel went on to earn a Bachelor's degree at Troy University in Environmental Science after attending Enterprise State. He worked in the manufacturing industry, then bought an H&R Block franchise, which grew to 16 franchises. In 2022, he graduated from Enterprise's CDL truck driving program and earned his CDL license. When Mr. McDaniel's son enrolled in the Aviation College in 2024, he also enrolled and currently attends classes while driving a fuel truck in Ozark. He maintains a 3.9 Aviation GPA and has taken on special projects.

Mr. McDaniel briefly spoke on his experience at Enterprise State. He stated that at age 55, he is attending for the third time. He stated that in 1970-71 his father attended on the GI bill. In 1986, Mr. McDaniel took the ACT test with plans to attend college. In 1987, he competed on a scholars' bowl team; in 1988-90, he attended Enterprise State, then went on to Troy State University. In 2016, his daughter attended dual enrollment classes at Enterprise, then went on to Birmingham Southern for a Bachelor's degree and a Master's at Miami University. In 2022, Mr. McDaniel received his CDL license and was offered a job that same day. When his son decided to attend Aviation school, Mr. McDaniel did as well. He has now earned his Airframe Certification from the FAA and will finish his Powerplant certification in Spring 2026.

Mr. Long next introduced Enterprise ambassador student, Bryce Griffin. Mr. Griffin's interest in math and engineering led him to attend Enterprise State on an Ambassador scholarship. He hopes to transfer to Auburn University next summer for a Bachelor's degree in Chemical Engineering and then apply to medical school.

Mr. Griffin stated that being an ambassador student has allowed him to earn an excellent education and develop his communication skills. He stated that the sense of community at Enterprise allows students to form meaningful connections on and off campus. He added that the college has some of the finest teachers in the state and they are willing to assist any student. He further added that President Long often interacts with students and remembers their faces and names. He stated that the faculty and staff at Enterprise State are genuinely invested in the students and go out of their way to support the students. He added that the past year has made him confident that choosing Enterprise State was the right choice, because he has gained not only an excellent education, but personal and professional growth that will benefit him in the future.

President Long summarized by thanking the trustees, legislators, and guests for their support.

BEVILL STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE
EQUIPMENT PURCHASE, INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPLIES, AND PROGRAM SUPPORT
SERVICES TO SUPPORT WEATHERIZATION TRAINING INITIATIVES

APPROVAL OF CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION CENTER DEVELOPMENT
AGREEMENT WITH MARION COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

On motion by Mr. Lightsey, second by Mr. Mitchell, the Board of Trustees authorized the President of Bevill State Community College and the Alabama Community College System to enter into a Career Technical Education Center Development Agreement with Marion County Board of Education.

TRENHOLM STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE
EDUCATIONAL HUB DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COLLEGE AND
MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

On motion by Mr. Mitchell, second by Mr. Rhone, the Board of Trustees authorized Trenholm State Community College to proceed with the agreement named Educational Hub Development Agreement between the College and Montgomery County Board of Education. The agreement will transfer five parcels of property from the College's West Campus, as a Deed of Gift, to Montgomery County Board of Education.

The agreement will grant Montgomery County Board of Education an ownership interest in the College's West Campus on or before December 31, 2025. The College will remain in possession of the campus under a license agreement until no later than December 31, 2026, when the College shall vacate the premises.

Fiscal Consideration: The term of this agreement shall be for a period of twenty (20) academic years commencing January 1, 2026, until December 31, 2046.

SECTION XI **CHANCELLOR'S REPORT**

Dr. Neil Scott, Vice Chancellor of Student Success, presented the latest enrollment numbers. Per Dr. Scott, as of December 8, 2025, Spring 2026 enrollment shows an 11.2% increase in for-credit courses and a 10.1% increase in credit hours over Spring 2025. He added that Spring 2025 enrollment was 22.8% over Spring 2024, Summer 2025 was 9.8% over Summer 2024, and Fall 2025 was 8.9% over Fall 2024 in head count. In 2025, there were 150,377 students enrolled.

Dr. Scott further added that dual enrollment is strong, with over 40,000 students from all 67 counties participating. He introduced a 30-second video advertisement showcasing dual enrollment. He stated that affordability and access are driving this growth. The ACCS has seen a 91% student pass rate with a C or higher, and 143 Associate degrees earned before or by high school graduation. He added that dual enrollment provides faster transition to the workforce and exposure to high-demand fields as early as 10th grade. Dr. Scott further stated that we have a lot of capacity for growth.

Chancellor Baker next introduced Mr. Alan Bates to speak on External Affairs issues. Per Mr. Bates, the ACCS is the most valuable resource in workforce development and education. His goal is to ensure that every legislator knows the mission of the ACCS. He added that compensation and health insurance increases are big issues now and he will focus on advocating for our needs. Mr. Bates ended by introducing his staff.

Mr. Keith Phillips, Deputy Chancellor of Workforce Development, next spoke on Economic Development. Per Mr. Phillips, Eli Lilly has announced that they will invest in a \$6 billion facility in Huntsville, bringing in about 3,600 jobs. He mentioned that Ms. Melody Whitten, Chief Economic Development Officer, has worked on 130 projects, and was instrumental in the Eli Lilly investment. Per Mr. Phillips, the CEO of Eli Lilly stated that they visited 300 sites in 44 states, and the deciding factor that made them choose Alabama was innovation and workforce.

Calhoun Community College President Jimmy Hodges stated that Ms. Whitten was very instrumental in bringing Eli Lilly to the state and she has worked closely with Calhoun Community College. Per President Hodges, Eli Lilly toured Calhoun and commented that they will need welders and that Calhoun had a fine welding program. Calhoun will also be providing a clean room simulator to accommodate Eli Lilly's needs. This is the first time in history that a community college will be offering pre-employment training for AIDT.
